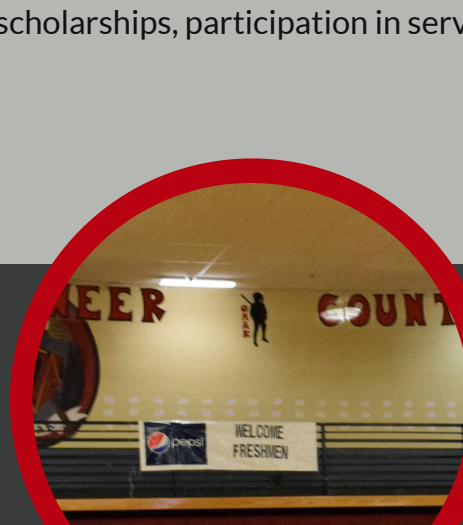

The National Honor Society (NHS) is a nationwide organization for high school students in the United States and outlying territories, which consists of many chapters in high schools. Selection is based on four criteria, or the pillars of NHS: scholarship (academic achievement), leadership, service, and character. National Honor Society is an invitation-only club for juniors and seniors. Prospective members are invited after the first semester of their sophomore or junior years and will receive only one invitation to apply. Members must have earned a minimum 3.75 GPA and are required to maintain that standard. During the application process, prospective members must demonstrate their commitment to community service, scholarship, leadership, and character. A resume, three confidential letters of recommendation, and an essay are required. If selected, members are inducted by ceremony into NHS and are eligible for the advantages of membership, including scholarships, participation in service projects, and wearing the NHS stole at graduation.

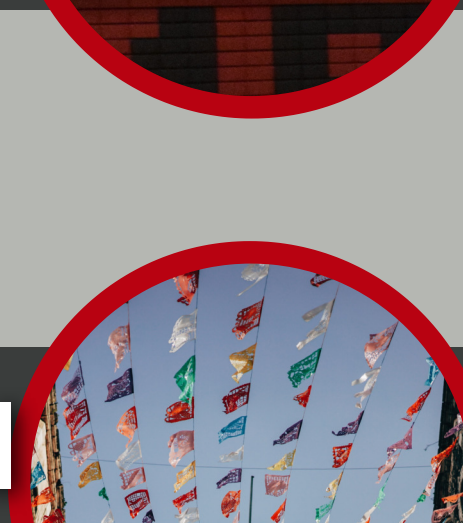
